After two years of submission, it is apparent that the method of assessment—the use of course grades—is not providing a sufficient indication of program outcomes. For the spring 2021 semester, a method using pretests and posttests was used. The implementation was incomplete and uneven. The program is going to work to secure greater consistency in implementation during the fall 2021 semester and beyond.
